WHAT DOES THE PRESIDENT'S ANNOUNCEMENT MEAN FOR DACA?

NO AGE CAP!

You no longer have to be younger than 30 years old to qualify for DACA. This means you cannot be too old as long as you meet the other requirements.

THE YEARS YOU MUST HAVE LIVED IN THE US HAS CHANGED

To qualify for DACA now you need to have lived in the US since January 1, 2010. The date was moved ahead almost 3 years, so now more people can qualify!

THREE-YEAR DACA GRANTS

Starting immediately, new first-time and renewal applicants will receive deferred action and work permits for 3 years instead of 2.
